

Line 3 IAMC Emergency Management Planning Initiative (EMPI)

Supporting Community Led Emergency Preparedness

The Line 3 Indigenous Advisory and Monitoring Committee (Line 3 IAMC) is delivering the Emergency Management Planning Initiative (EMPI) to strengthen emergency preparedness among Line 3-impacted First Nations and Métis communities in Alberta, Saskatchewan, and Manitoba.

The EMPI provides fully funded support to develop or enhance emergency management planning in ways that reflect local priorities and Indigenous knowledge, and is:

- **Community led** – guided by local priorities
- **Flexible** – paced around community availability *
- **Culturally grounded** – integrates Indigenous knowledge
- **Practical** – focused on usable plans and training

** Please note: Work must be completed by March 31, 2027.*

What the Program Offers

Communities receive tailored support from Indigenous consultants to provide:

- Community Risk Assessment
- Development or update of Emergency Management / Response Plans CEMP/ERP)
- Incident Command System (ICS) training
- Tabletop exercises to test plans
- Practical Quick Reference Guides



How It Works

1. **Community Interest Survey** – identifies interest, readiness, and timing
2. **Community Expression of Interest (EOI)** – confirms scope and priorities
3. **Line 3 IAMC will Review & Approve** – based on readiness and alignment
4. **Community Implementation** – direct work with consultants to deliver planning and training

Current Status (Spring 2026)

- Multiple communities have completed surveys and EOIs
- Several communities are approved and beginning work
- Additional communities continue to express interest
- Work is being sequenced based on capacity and timing
